From the savannahs of Zimbabwe to its tropical mountains comes ZimSculpt, a collection of spectacular sculptures by some of the world most-renowned artists practicing Shona sculpture.



This summer more than 100 sculptures will be on exhibition, presented in conjunction with a new seasonal display produced by the staff at Daniel Stowe Botanical Garden. Based in Harare, Zimbabwe, ZimSculpt, will also feature the work of visiting artists Passmore Mupindiko and Patrick Sehani in a unique marketplace of Zimbabwe art, including work they produce right here at the Garden.

Passed down from generation to generation, ZimSculpt features contemporary art produced by hand and typically without sketches or plans. They are produced from the iron-rich stone in the geologic family Serpentine, a hard stone that produces hundreds of colors. The subjects come from the creativity of the artist and often reflect daily life and culture of southern Africa.
